Simonstown Gaels GAA Club aims to promote Gaelic Games in the Navan area and is committed to the physical, social and personal development of all members. Administrative Structures

The Executive Committee is the controlling body of the Club. The Executive Committee is elected by the registered full members present at the Annual General Meeting. A sub-committee structure exists that includes Adult Football, Minor Football, Juvenile Football, Ladies Football, Finance, Development, Bar/Social and Grounds committees. All these committees fall under the jurisdiction of the Executive Committee. The main business of the club is conducted at the AGM where the Secretary presents an annual report on the affairs of the club and the Treasurer presents a full set of audited accounts to the Membership.

Club Code of Ethics

Mission Statement

Simonstown Gaels GAA Club aims to promote Gaelic Games in the Navan area and is committed to the physical, social and personal development of all members. The Club policy is to encourage active participation by all players to achieve their potential in a structured, safe and disciplined environment. The overall aim is to create a community spirit for the benefit of all through committing Simonstown Gaels to excellence on and off the playing fields. The club is fully committed also to the promotion of Irish Culture and the Irish Language.

Code of Conduct - Mentors, Parents, all Club Officials, Supporters, Members

1. Young people need a Manager/Mentor whom they can respect. Lead by example.
2. Be generous with your praise when it is deserved.
3. All Club Mentors, Supporters, Parents are expected to treat their own players, opposition players, officials and the referee with due courtesy and respect.
4. Mentors should not use bad language or engage in threatening or aggressive behaviour on the sideline or in dressing rooms.
5. Mentors should stay off the pitch at all times unless the referee gives them permission to enter.
6. Mentors should always remember that they should try to play the game through the eyes of the under age player and allow them to express themselves in a disciplined manner.
7. Unless circumstances of bad behaviour arise, Mentors should offer positive encouragement to players at all times.
8. While it is always good to encourage players to try their best, it is vital to remember that the enjoyment and well-being of the player is far more important than the winning or losing.
9. Never ridicule, humiliate or shout at players for missing a score, making a mistake or losing a match.
10. Parents are expected to be very positive and supportive towards their son/daughter on the playing field and toward club mentors.

Code of Conduct - Players

1. Play for enjoyment, to improve your skills and to feel good.
2. Play with control. Do not lose your temper.
3. Play for yourself and your team, your team's performance will benefit and so will your own.
4. Players are expected to behave in an orderly manner and to show respect and courtesy to Club Officials and visiting Teams.
5. Players will be expected to abide by referees decisions at all times and should not get involved in using abusive language to match officials.
6. No type of violent conduct will be tolerated, whether it is directed towards teammates, opposition players, visiting officials or club members.
7. Loud, threatening, abusive or bad language is unacceptable.
8. Players are expected to respect the property of others. This includes dressing rooms for both home and away games, travelling by bus or car, in shops, restaurants etc. when teams stop to or from matches.
9. Players are expected to take instruction from their Mentors and not to engage in any behaviour which could bring the good name of Simonstown Gaels into disrepute.
10. Failure by any individual associated with Simonstown Gaels to abide by the above or any complaint which is made to the Club Executive about the behaviour of any Mentor, Parent, Supporter, Player or Member will be fully investigated and will result in:
 - a) Appearing before the Club's Disciplinary Committee.
 - b) Reprimand from the Club's Disciplinary Committee.
 - c) Appearing before the Executive Committee if necessary.
 - d) Suspension or barring from the club.

N.B. Simonstown Gaels is bound by the GAA's code of ethics, a copy of which is available to all members.

CHILD PROTECTION CODE OF PRACTICE

Gaeil Baile Shíomóin CLG (Simonstown Gaels GAA)

POLICY STATEMENT

Children are the most important members in our club.

We at **Gaeil Baile Shíomóin CLG (Simonstown Gaels GAA)** aim to promote the participation of children in our club by creating a culture of safety and fun.

“Children have the right to be protected from all forms of violence. They must be kept safe from harm and they must be given proper care by those looking after them”

(Article 19 : UN Convention on the Rights of the Child)

All children’s sport should be conducted in an atmosphere of fair play. Ireland has adopted and is committed to the European Code of Sport Ethics which defines fair play as:

“much more than playing within the rules. It incorporates the concepts of friendship, respect for others and always playing within the right spirit. Fair play is defined as a way of thinking, not just a way of behaving. It incorporates issues concerned with the elimination of cheating, gamesmanship, doping, violence (both physical and verbal), exploitation, unequal opportunities, excessive commercialism and corruption.”

(European Sports Charter and Code of Ethics, Council of Europe, 1993)

All club members, through their actions reflect the principles and guidelines contained in the ‘Code of Ethics & Good Practice for Children’s Sport in Ireland.’ We promote the aims and ideals of our Association, adhere to its policy and nurture our Gaelic culture.

STANDARDS SET BY Gaeil Baile Shíomóin CLG (Simonstown Gaels GAA)

WILL BE ACHIEVED THROUGH ENSURING THE FOLLOWING:-

- Awareness of the issues which lead to children being harmed
- Safe recruiting procedures for coaches/volunteers, careful selection
- Provision of Irish Sports Council approved Child Protection awareness workshops for coaches and administrators
- Application of codes of behaviour for coaches/volunteers
- Application of codes of behaviour for children/young people
- Application of codes of behaviour for parents
- Application of good and safe working/playing practices
- Establishment of procedures for dealing with/recording of complaints/accidents, report books detailing facts, witnesses, circumstances etc.
- Procedures relating specifically to bullying, away trips and photography
- Identification and maintenance of parental responsibility
- Availability of information
- Regular review and monitoring of Child Protection procedures by the management committee
- All children are treated equally

The policy applies to all those involved in **Gaeil Baile Shíomóin CLG (Simonstown Gaels GAA)** as coaches, administrators, officials, volunteer drivers, parents/guardians and children.

DESIGNATED PERSON (with respect to Child Protection)

The ‘contact person’ or Designated Person within **Gaeil Baile Shíomóin CLG (Simonstown Gaels GAA)** is:

The designated person is the club chairperson.

Name of designated person shall be made known to all in the club. He/she is the person to whom child protection concerns will be addressed. If the concern is about the designated person, please report to the County Chairman.

The club has procedures in place for dealing with concerns or allegation of abuse either within the club or externally but the first point of contact for the child, parent/guardian or coach is the designated person. However, any individual has the right to contact Social Services or PSNI directly if they have concern about a child's welfare.

CLUB CHILDREN'S OFFICER (possibly YOUTH OFFICER)

The Children's Officer (CO) is a member of the management committee.

The CO is the link between youth mentors, members and management. It is essential that this communication line is clear and working. CO may be assisted by others whose details, along with the club chairperson's, are prominently displayed in e.g. club changing rooms, offices, pavillion. CO's function is to engender a child-centred club ethos, promote ethics and good practice, influence club policy and report to the management committee and designated person.

GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING ACCIDENTS

In the event of an accident the following procedure will be followed:

Contact parents/guardians in the event of all accidents.

Fill in 2 copies of the Accident Form for ALL accidents. One copy to incident book/folder, other to designate person for filing/further action

- For more serious accidents:
- Contact emergency services/G.P. if necessary
- Record detailed facts surrounding accident, witnesses etc.
- Complete accident form/book as above
- All serious accidents should be reported through County Secretary to Croke Park

GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING ALLEGATIONS/INCIDENTS

- Record all incidents reported or observed on an incident form, forward to the designated person (club chairperson).
- Ensure confidentiality – a 'need to know basis'
- The designated person is responsible for report security
- Adhere to An Cumann Lúthchleas Gael's *Guidelines for Dealing with Allegations of Abuse* (2nd ed., March 2001)

GOOD AND SAFE WORKING/PLAYING PRACTICES

Gaeil Baile Shíomóin CLG (Simonstown Gaels GAA) will ensure:

- Promotion of a healthy lifestyle by practice and example
- Proper supervision of children within the club with adequate numerical and male/female coach:child ratio
- Use of safe recommended equipment
- Supervision of equipment used
- A clearly defined, fenced play area that is safe from vehicular traffic
- Public Liability insurance covering all members of the club
- Only children of similar age will train/play together, no children training/competing with children two or more age groups older than their own age group
- First aid assistance and first aid equipment is available in case of accident, with accident/incident books documented where necessary
- N.B. All accidents will be reported to parents/guardians
- Transport will be provided and supervised by volunteers in possession of driving licences and roadworthy vehicles only. Prior parental permission is essential as per registration form
- A safe environment for members
- Ongoing training and information for Leaders
- Implementation of policy and procedures in line with guidance from *Our Duty to Care* and *Code of Ethics and Good Practice for Children's Sport*
- Facilitation of open discussion on member protection issues
- Support to members who report allegations of abuse
- Suspected abuse information is treated confidentially

- Appropriate action is taken if members breach standards of reasonable behaviour
- The establishment and maintenance of a coaching register
- The setting of standards of good practice
- The Designated Officer has knowledge of child protection procedures and responsibility in reporting concerns
- That parents/guardians are kept informed and have access to the club's policy guidelines for away trips/overnight stays and use of photography/videos
- The implementation of good and safe working practice is developed to the mutual benefit of the member, local area and community

Gaeil Baile Shíomóin CLG (Simonstown Gaels GAA) has the right to:

- Expect leaders to comply with its Code of Conduct
- Expect all children to maintain standards of reasonable behaviour
- Take appropriate action if members breach the Code of Conduct or Child Protection Policy
- Expect all members to undertake appropriate training when advised to
- Expect leaders will not abuse children physically, emotionally or sexually
- Take appropriate action in the event of accusations
- Acquire pre-employment checks on all coaches
- Maintain records on individuals in line with advice from data protection agency, i.e. only hold records on individuals that they have justifiable reason for holding
- Adhere to An Cumann Lúthchleas Gael's *Guidelines for Dealing with Allegations of Abuse* (2nd ed., March 2001)
- Adhere to An Cumann Lúthchleas Gael's *Code of Best Practice for Youth Sport* (December 2002)

CODES OF BEHAVIOUR FOR CHILDREN

Children are expected to:

- Enjoy their GAA activity
- Keep within the defined area of the playing/coaching area
- Behave acceptably and listen to the coach
- Respect GAA personnel and equipment
- Refrain from using bad language and racial/sectarian references
- Refrain from bullying and rough/dangerous play
- Respect other children and adults
- Keep safe
- Report inappropriate behaviour and risky situations
- Play fairly
- Respect officials and accept decisions
- Show appropriate loyalty and be gracious in defeat
- Respect opponents and team mates
- Not cheat
- Not use violence

Children have the right to:

- Safety
- Be listened to
- Respect
- Privacy
- Enjoyment of sport in a safe environment
- Referral to professional help if necessary
- Protection from abuse
- Equality and fair involvement
- Experience competition and a healthy desire to win
- Be believed
- Ask for help
- Any misdemeanours and general misbehaviour will be dealt with by the immediate coaches and reported to the designated person where deemed necessary. Persistent misbehaviour will result in dismissal from the club. Parents/guardians will be informed.
- Dismissal can be appealed with final decisions taken by the club committee.

CODES OF BEHAVIOUR FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Parents/Guardians are expected to:

- Complete and return club registration form for **Gaeil Baile Shíomóin CLG (Simonstown Gaels GAA)**
- Deliver and collect children punctually
- Ensure child is properly attired for weather conditions
- Ensure proper kit is worn at all times
- Detail any health concerns pertaining to the child on the consent/registration form, particularly respiratory problems, allergies. Any health concerns should be notified to the coach before a match/training
- Inform the coach beforehand if the child is to be collected early
- Encourage the child to play to his/her best, fairly
- Show good example
- Encourage all children's efforts, listen and be positive
- Behave responsibly on sidelines
- Appreciate and respect the coach
- Be realistic
- Ensure child's hygiene and nutritional requirements are met
- Promote child's participation for fun

Parents/Guardians have the right to:

- Know the child is safe
- Be informed of problems or concerns relating to the child
- Be informed if the child is injured
- Have consent sought for issues such as trips
- Contribute to decisions within the club
- Complain if there is concern about the standard of coaching
- Any misdemeanour or breach of this code of conduct will be dealt with individually by a club official. Persistent misbehaviour will result in the parent/guardian being asked not to attend if their presence is detrimental to child welfare.
- The ultimate action would be regrettably asking the child to leave the club.
